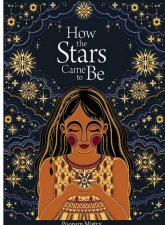
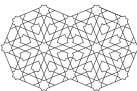
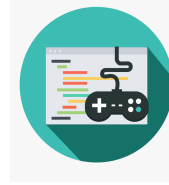




Our Year 5 Curriculum - Autumn 1



Big Question  Lens	Civilisation: What is the biggest achievement of the early Islamic civilisation?
Maths 	Place Value & Addition and Subtraction • Read, write, compare and order numbers up to 1,000,000. • Read and write Roman numerals. • Round numbers to the nearest 10, 100, 1,000, 10,000 and 100,000. • Use mental and written methods to add and subtract numbers with more than four digits. • Use inverse operations to check answers. • Solve reasoning, problem-solving and missing number questions.
English 	Holes & How the Stars Came to Be • Write using a range of conjunctions and adverbials. • Use consistent tense throughout writing. • Learn relative clauses, modal verbs and adverbs. • Use brackets, dashes, commas for parenthesis and inverted commas correctly. • Consolidate Years 3 and 4 spelling patterns and learn Year 5 statutory spellings. • Develop reading skills by clarifying vocabulary, making predictions, inferring and evaluating an author's language.
History 	Early Islamic Civilisation • Learn about Baghdad in AD 900. • Explore the achievements of the Golden Age of Islam. • Discover how Islamic civilisation has influenced life today. • Compare this non-European civilisation with British history.
Science 	Earth and Space • Learn about the movement of the Earth, Moon and Sun. • Explain how day and night occur. • Explore the Earth's place within the Solar System. • Investigate patterns in space.
Religious Education 	Reality: What is Real? • Explore beliefs about God, creation, the soul and reality. • Compare Abrahamic and Dharmic religions. • Discuss religious and non-religious worldviews. • Consider questions about truth, faith and evidence. Educational Visit - Mandir
Art 	Printing: Islamic Geometric Designs • Explore the history and features of Islamic art. • Study the work of Ayesha Gamiet. • Create geometric designs using lino printing techniques. • Experiment with a range of printing materials.

PSHE 	Connecting with Others • Explore the influences that shape identity, including family, culture, beliefs and interests. • Understand the importance of commitment and how families support one another. • Recognise the value of healthy friendships and positive relationships. • Learn strategies to build, maintain and repair friendships. • Develop self-regulation and assertiveness skills to manage disagreements respectfully. Music 	Composition: Space • Listen to music by Holst, Ligeti and Rimsky-Korsakov. • Improvise and compose music inspired by space. • Develop listening and appraisal skills. • Use musical elements to create compositions.
Computing 	Creating Media: Stop Motion • Create simple stop-motion animations. • Plan animations using storyboards. • Refine animations by editing frames and adding titles. • Give constructive feedback to improve work. Online Safety: Online Protection
