

English





Pupils will focus on sentence construction using a range of conjunctions. They will use adverbials of time, place and manner, and ensure that their tense is consistent throughout their writing. Weekly spelling lessons will embed previously taught spelling patterns from Years 3 and 4, and children will continue to learn the statutory spelling words. The following grammar and punctuation will be taught: relative clauses, adverbs and modal verbs, brackets, dashes and commas for parenthesis, apostrophes for possession (singular and plural), and inverted commas for direct speech.

Reading lessons will focus on clarifying the meaning of new and unfamiliar words, inferring using evidence from the text, making predictions based on what has been read and evaluating the language used by the author.


