

Our Year 5 Curriculum - Autumn 2



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
Vikings: ruthless killers or peaceful settlers? This big question has centred our learning forcing children to challenge the traditional views of Vikings as brutal warriors.

Maths



After securing children's understanding of place value, we will now consolidate their understanding of the **four operations** (addition, subtraction, multiplication and division) and apply this knowledge to **statistics**.

English



Writing:

Inspired by 'Norse Myths', children will write their own version of a Viking Myth after being immersed in the worlds of the Viking Gods.

History



The Vikings and the Anglo-Saxons

The Viking and Anglo-Saxon struggle for the kingdom of England to the time of Edward the Confessor.

Science



Properties of Materials

Compare and group together everyday materials on the basis of their properties, Know that some materials will dissolve in liquid to form a solution, and describe how to recover a substance from a solution.

Use knowledge of solids, liquids and gases to decide how mixtures might be separated

Build on their knowledge from Autumn 1 and identify the place of worship and its significance. Compare the place of worship to other religions.

PSHE



What makes up a person's identity?

Recognise and respect similarities and differences between people and what they have in common with others.

Identify that there are a range of factors that contribute to a person's identity. Understand how to challenge stereotypes and assumptions about others.

Music



Rehearse and perform in preparation for the Winter Concert.

Computing



Skills Showcase: Mars Rover 2

Exploring how the Mars rover moves, follows instructions, collects and sends data. Children deepen their understanding of how computers work, what data is and how it is transferred as well as developing their 3D design skills. They also examine one of the most useful types of data received from the rover and learn how to reduce the file size so that it can be sent quickly.

French	La Date Know numbers to 31 and can count in 10s to 100. Know the months of the year and the seasons in French. Ask for the date in French and say the correct date.	
Outdoor PE	American Football Children will continue to develop their hand-eye coordination and cooperation skills when playing games in a team, as we develop their understanding of American Football. They will focus on the throws, catches and sequencing plays.
